

A Taste of Christmas Around the World

here has never been a scene like it. Literally people from every tribe and nation and people and language there. A multitude from around the world, all interacting and enjoying each other. No violence, war is over. No bitterness or jealousy but rather generosity and love and a deep rooted Shalom – peace – not just a ceasefire or truce. This is the greatest feast of all time.

The banqueting table – if you can call it that because it has to be unimaginably vast – has every food that delights the taste buds and satisfies the soul. Every dish from around the world that is used in celebration along with full-bodied wines and the most refreshing water ever tasted.

This feast makes the biggest Christmas gatherings rather dull and paltry in comparison. In fact all parties and feasts are only a shadowy preview and foretaste of this Great Banquet celebration.

This is the picture that the Bible paints of heaven: a whole new creation with all the wars and tears of sadness gone. Salvation Supper for all those who have responded to the invitation of the King of Heaven. For them there's a hope that doesn't end in a funeral but a feast. The future is not a bore, but a banquet.

And all this is because of Christmas ... When One from heaven came to earth to rescue us from ourselves and all our failures and guilt and sins and bring us in to His Salvation Supper. Remember the shepherds on the hillside that first Christmas? Look at their excitement when they heard about the Saviour being born.

An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: you will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger.'

Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, **'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favour rests.'** (The Bible: Luke's Gospel, chapter 2, verses 9–14)

Today, all around the world, on every continent, people enjoy eating special foods that celebrate the birth of Jesus the Saviour. That is why this Christmas we are putting on **A Taste** of Christmas Around the World.

These films are watched in my home every Christmas without fail otherwise 'it just doesn't feel like Christmas'. They bring excitement, laughter and a few tears, but what makes them candidates for the best Christmas films of all time? It must be much more than the obvious fact that they are all set during the Yuletide season and are fun family traditions. I would argue three things.

The main characters are all unexpected heroes. Each one has some humble character trait about them that means they are overlooked or underestimated. Whether it's George Bailey's big-hearted, seemingly naive willingness to help people even at great personal cost or John MacLaine's never-say-die attitude that leads him to literally crawl over broken glass to rescue the Nagasaki hostages. They are all willing to 'make themselves nothing' for those in need.

All these flicks have **relationships at the heart** of their stories. They either start in the middle of a broken relationship ('good luck, Buddy, I hope you find your dad') or something



threatens to break them apart. However, by the end, there are satisfying resolutions all round that spell restoration for families, and even celebration for whole cities ('Case dismissed! Santa Claus wins! – New York goes wild!').

The best Christmas movies containing both above elements will always remind you of the original and greatest 'Christmas movie' because it is the story our hearts were made for. The 2000-year-old true story that, according to eyewitness accounts, really happened in a small town about six miles from Jerusalem. When a young family, who had already been through their fair share of scandal (almost ending their relationship before it even started), was forced to give birth to their child with an audience of animals, and lay him where one of those animals scoffed

He made his dwelling among us so that he could die to fix the ultimate broken relationship between humankind and himself. As the famous carol says, 'God and sinners reconciled'.
